A PERSONAL NOTE FROM EXCUTIVE DIRECTOR, JEANNE BUFFINGTON

Winter has arrived which means grant writing season at Rape Response. The crisp temperatures lead me to reflect on the spring, summer and fall months that have passed. My reflections lead me to gratitude, which is appropriate at this time of year. Grant writing season has a similar effect on me. Funders ask about the highlights of the year, the numbers of individuals benefitting from our programs, successes we've shared &

challenges we've faced. There is data to be gathered, finances to review and most importantly, survivor stories to be celebrated. It's often the first time I slow down enough to consider the significant details in the big picture of our work throughout the year.

Our staff, contractors and crisis line volunteers recognize the unique individual needs of each survivor; they accept the 24/7 schedule and on-call hours; they are compassionate and giving beyond words. Our survivors are courageous as they step onto the path of healing, accept the challenges and hard work before them, and one day at a time, they keep moving forward. Our collaborative partners medical, judicial, law enforcement and academic - see the roles they play in the lives of survivors, and they carry out their professional responsibilities while juggling so many cases. Our Board is supportive and encouraging as they use their own unique skills and wisdom to guide us. Our donors and funders are the heroes who make our work possible, for lives affected by sexual violence to be changed, for survivor services to be offered 24/7 and for Let's Talk© prevention education, outreach and awareness programs to be provided. It takes a team to do this work! I hope that as you review the statistics on page two, you will be fully aware of your hero status and your value to our work. We are deeply grateful.

MORE THAN A CRISIS LINE...

Rape Response is a nonprofit agency providing 24/7 services to sexual assault survivors, ages 13 & older, in Dawson, Forsyth, Habersham, Hall, Lumpkin & White counties. Advocacy in action for fiscal year 2020-2021 included:

- **830** survivors & their loved ones were supported by RRI staff & volunteers.
- 2,022 New Crisis Calls & 2,803 Follow Up Crisis **Calls** provided survivors with information, resources & emotional support to address sexual trauma.
- 352 Individual Therapy sessions & 36 Support **Group** sessions were provided by our therapist.
- Advocates supported survivors during 398 Crisis Intervention sessions, equipping them with essential tools needed on their path to healing.
- Personal Advocacy helped survivors to navigate health care, law enforcement, criminal justice, Title IX • & other social service agencies. 2,907
- 723 Information & Referrals connected survivors to community resources for continued support & healing.
- Court Accompaniment ensured survivors were supported during trial & court proceedings for a total • of 42 days.

- Medical Accompaniment Due to COVID-19 restrictions, advocates were not able to provide in person support to every survivor. NGMC Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) connected us with survivors after each Forensic Medical Exam. 84
- Aftercare Referrals & Information offered survivors health care exams for STI's; paid for by RRI & provided by local health departments. 89
- Let's Talk© Programs were provided to 8,332 middle school students, **1,312** high school students, **78** at-risk youth, 87 parents & educators.
- College Advocacy & Outreach was provided at 59 events to **2,748** students, faculty & staff at 6 colleges/universities across 10 campuses.
- **Collaborations** included in interagency engagement opportunities to benefit survivors with 146 agencies & over 18,800 participants .
- Staff participated in 620 crisis coordination meetings to better serve survivors.
